



PERFORMING ARTS CONTRIBUTION



Each year at Alawa we have a focus in Term 3 on the Performing Arts and we secure the support from an external provider specialising in dance / movement etc for the term and we then have a culminating event later in the term as major community event and fundraiser. In 2024 [as we did in 2023]we are working with the fantastic team from Royal Existence. We have met with the team to design the program for this year, allocate dance and music to each class and they have now developed the routines and choreography.

The team come in each week and lead dance session with each class through the term. They work with the children and teachers on the performance item which we all get to enjoy on September 5th.

Our theme this year will be An Olympic Opening ceremony.

This program costs in excess of \$9 000 per year and is generally funded through the support from parents allocating \$24per student through their Back to School Vouchers [BTSV] for the program. From reviewing our record it appears some families elected not to contribute any of the funds from BTSV this year to this program so we are asking those families for their consideration of an additional payment of \$24 towards the program for this year.

FARM PROGRAM SEMESTER 2

Larrakia Season: Gurrulwa guligi - Big Wind Time, so is the time of year that northwest winds breeze through our teaching garden, lots of flowering trees like the Kapok add that little bit of extra brightness. We are loving sitting and playing in our garden at this time of year, if there is anyone who might have some donations of windchimes, a wooden swing, or some cement/wooden benches please let us know.

Farm News: We think our Guinea Pigs GiGi and Geoffry are pregnant again! We are looking for any donations of guineapig or rabbit equipment or toys for example toilet trays, drinkers, mats, and smaller cages, so we can be a bit more prepared this time around. We will keep you posted on her progress!





Farm Semester: Let me share our semester 2 overview at the Farm, hopefully it will give you lots to talk about with your little scientists. If you have any specialism in the learning below and would like to volunteer some time, please let us know!

In Transition, we're continuing to explore the fascinating plants and animals at the Farm. We encourage students to classify living things based on their external features and movements. Transition students will also help update the Farm's front sign by drawing some glorious animals

This semester, Year I and 2 classes have been discovering all about Bugs! Through their exploration, students will learn about insect needs, habitats, and how sunlight creates shadows that many bugs use for hiding. Next term, we hope to observe 'beneficial' bugs in a bug observatory.

In Year 3 Nguyen and 3/4 Gardner, students are designing a First Nations 'Yarning Circle' a circle of benches to tell stories and observe nature. Thanks to a generous \$1000 grant from Landcare Australia, we've bought bright paints and tools to bring the students designs to life. We will continue to discuss the importance of sustainability, reusing resources, and the natural materials that were used in traditional rock art from a First Nations perspective. If there is any First Nations person in our community that would be willing to come and share some traditional stories, we would love to hear from you.

In Year 4/5 Daniels and Chamberlain classes, our focus is on the water cycle at the Farm. We're closely examining our Aquaponics system and exploring sustainable water usage. We will be completing some interesting water experiments in the next little while, especially with the weather heating up.

For Year 5/6 classes, we're working on the Alawa Farm Sustainability Project 2024. After focusing on water last year, this year's big question is, "How can we enhance our food production to meet a range of needs within our school community?" Students are investigating and implementing sustainable solutions in engaging ways. Some exciting projects include growing more tomatoes, building a small red claw aquaponics system, creating water-saving wicking beds, designing a fun space to encourage more students to work on the Farm, and developing a chicken care schedule to improve chicken happiness and egg production.

We have many great ideas, and we hope all of them will be successful!


CLASSROOM NEWS TRANSITION HUGHES

BOOK FAIR








HOUSE POINTS

In the lead for the Year to date is Goyder with 90091 points!




CLASS POINTS




Family holidays / absences during school



For Week 5 it was fabulouso to see 4/5 Chamberlain with only I late arrival.






RECYCLING





Update on changes to Middle Schooling in the NT

The Department of Education can provide the following updates:

- There will be no changes to the current middle school model in 2025, this means there will be no changes for students or families in 2025
- The department recognizes the move away from the current model will take time and careful planning
- modes will take time and careful planning.

 Changes will take a collaborative effort, following consultation with stakeholders, including students, families, educators, school communities and peak bodies
